We now have a new pole barn at the farm! An Amish contractor built the outer structure and we did all the inside and finish work (some of that work took place after these photos). The barn will hold plenty of hay and some equipment on one side. The other half will give the horses a winter roof and shelter plenty big enough for them all. It will make it nicer for the horses, easier for us to feed and is the beginning of some revamping of the farm. With the barn as a focal point we are repairing fence line, tending some of our pasture fields, and creating more trails for riding, hiking and mountain biking. This work will enable us to make better and more frequent use of our 128 acre farm. The farm creates many more activity opportunities for our campers, especially some ½ day events.









It is funny to see them all come up when we are working, checking out the job and wondering why we don't have any bridles and saddles with our tools. All of them have a winter coat now and look great.








A shoreline restoration project scheduled for this winter will completely makeover the look of our waterfront. This is the largest project ever undertaken at camp and we are very excited! Most of you know that erosion has been an issue along our shoreline for many years. This work will lay a silt screen below the waterline, clear the shore 10' back at a slope and cover the slope with rip rap rock mixed with shrubs. There will be 12" Coir logs on top with erosion preventive vegetation planted past the slope. Coir logs are biodegradable made mostly of coconut husks. This work will change the appearance and solidify the shoreline along the entire length below the ball field, enlarge the boat harbor, go around the point to



the beach. It picks up again by the diving board and along the shore towards the stables. The boat harbor and swim area will be dredged and new sand put on the beach. This project is put together by the Muskingum Watershed Conservation District. We are tremendously appreciative of the work that they do and their support for this project. This will absolutely improve our facilities and allow us to expand our boating and our nature programs. We will keep you updated on the progress as the winter comes in.
